Belief in Absolute Truth: What it IS and What it is NOT

Belief in absolute truth (A.T.) in our culture is waning away. Three fourths of Americans deny the reality of A.T. including among Christians (https://www.focusonthefamily.com/church/absolute-truth/). I believe that skepticism about A.T. has a lot to do with misunderstanding that term. Let me begin by stating what belief in A.T. does NOT mean. Belief in A.T. does not claim that we either know all there is to know or that we have a capacity to understand everything. Neither does belief in A.T. claim that we are correct about everything we *think* we know. Instead belief in absolute truth holds that truth is not "*in the eyes of the beholder*," but instead exists as an unchangeable reality which is independent of our personal wishes. Belief in A.T. finally trusts that mathematics, rationality (logic), moral principles, and the existence of God, are unalterable. Although no one can fully comprehend these truths, Jesus says we can grow in our knowledge of truth by seeking it in trust that it is there to be found (Matt. 7:7).

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
